

Southern Pulpwood Production, 1987

Introduction

"Southern Pulpwood Production" is an annual report published by the Southeastern and Southern Forest Experiment Stations for the 12 Southern States. The volume of raw material shipments between regions is obtained by exchanging information with other Experiment Stations. Findings represent a 100-percent canvass of pulpmills. Volumes are recorded in standard cords. Roundwood is reported by county; residues by State.

Highlights

More than 62 million cords of pulpwood were consumed during 1987 by 106 pulpmills operating in the South. This was a 3-percent increase over 1986. Mill capacity increased by almost 3 percent to 123,189 tons per day. One pulpmill was added during 1987; another was under construction.

Pulpwood Production

The economy continued to expand during 1987. With demand for paper products increasing, pulpmills operated at near capacity. Pulpwood production increased by 3 percent and totaled more than 62 million cords (see table 1). All types of material used for pulp increased except hardwood roundwood, which declined by 1 percent. The major source of raw material continues to be softwood roundwood, which accounts for 45 percent of the total furnish. Pulpwood production for the Southeast and Midsouth regions increased by 4 and 2 percent, respectively.

Roundwood

Total roundwood production in the South increased by 2 percent, with softwood increasing 3 percent and hardwood decreasing by 1 percent. For the sixth year in a row, the five Southeastern States produced more softwood roundwood than the Midsouth. The Midsouth, however, produces more hardwood (see table 6). Georgia and Alabama continue as the highest producers of pulpwood. Georgia produced over 6 million cords of softwood--almost twice as much as any other State. Alabama was the leading producer of hardwood with 3 million cords. Five counties in the South produced 300,000 cords or more, 13 counties produced 200,000 cords or more, and 107 counties produced in excess of 100,000 cords. Monroe County, AL, and Taylor County, FL, were the leading producers with 350,000 cords each (see tables 7-18).

Plant Residues

In 1987, more than 21 million cords of wood residues--some 34 percent of the total production--were used for pulp. The proportion of residues to roundwood has been approximately the same for the last ten years. Total residues increased by 6 percent in 1987. Georgia used the most residues of any State--3.3 million cords--(see table 4). Chips accounted for 99 percent of the residues, with softwood making up 75 percent of this total (see table 5). The leading producer of hardwood residues was Arkansas with 834,600 cords. Percentagewise, Tennessee had the greatest increase, 33 percent, whereas Alabama declined by 8 percent.

Regional Differences

As shown in table 6, the Midsouth produced 53 percent of the South's pulpwood during 1987--33 of 62 million cords. It also produced both the most roundwood and residues during the year. The Southeast continued to lead the South in production of softwood roundwood, but the Midsouth produced more residue. Production of both hardwood roundwood and residue decreased in the Southeast, whereas increases occurred in the Midsouth.

Pulping Capacity

The addition of one pulpmill during 1987 brings the total number of mills operating in the South to 106. Pulping capacity increased by almost 3 percent

to a record 123,189 tons per day (see table 19). Sulfate continues to be the primary process for pulping, accounting for 78 percent of the capacity. Five mills from outside the Southern region drew part of their raw material from the South during 1987 (see table 20). One new pulpmill is under construction in Mississippi (see table 21).

Trends




Figure 1--Southern pulpwood production, 1960-1987.

Substantial increases in pulpwood production occurred between 1965 and 1970 and between 1975 and 1980. With greater use being made of hardwoods and all types of residues (fig. 1), however, pulpwood production since 1980 has increased at a much slower pace.





HARDWOOD ROUNDWOOD PRODUCTION, 1987




